The NOVO reseach network

The network supports the joint consideration of the following perspectives: work environment/employee perspective, quality/patient perspective and efficiency/societal perspective. The focused areas are health care organization, including hospital care, primary care, care of elderly and disabled.

The network promotes research and development initiatives by establishing meeting places for researchers and practitioners. During 2007 - 2009 the Nordic Council of Ministers granted the establishment and development of the network.

Activities within the network are for example a yearly Nordic symposium, national meetings between researchers and practice, summer school and joint research activities.

The 3rd NOVO Symposium was held in Copenhagen on December 9 and 10 at the National Research Centre for the Working Environment. There were about 55 participants and 30 presentations around the theme "Sustainable Nordic Health Care Systems". Jörgen Winkel was gratified for his work as the chair of the network during 2007-2009. 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TWO NORDIC MULTICENTER STUDIES IN PROGRESS:

Sustainable managerial & organizational conditions in hospitals

There seem to be a large variation in some managerial conditions and we do not know how variations in these conditions contribute to organisational sustainability

The multicenter study focuses on communication within hospital organizations, leadership - employee interaction and structural organizational conditions that creates a sustainable work environment, quality of care and effectiveness.

The focus is on the 1st and 2nd line managers at hospitals. They hold key positions through their closeness to practice and integrated responsibility for the work environment, the budget, and the development of caring-/

curing practice.

To successfully handle these challenges, not only personal skills but managerial support structures are need-


The study will investigate the importance managerial work conditions for communication down-wards and upwards within organization regarding quality of care, work environment and budget.

The first phase is descriptive. The second phase includes an intervention to

hospital steering groups. Variations between organisations and countries will be described and a Nordic model for sustainable managerial and organizational conditions will be formulated.

ErgoVSM—Ergonomic complement to value stream mapping tool



This multicenter study will further develop the usability of the tool "ErgoVSM"- an ergonomic complement to the central lean tool "value stream mapping". The tool has been developed to improve healthcare processes without undue mental and physical work intensification. The purpose of the study is to test, evaluate and improve this tool.

The research project will analyze if the prototype ErgoVSM

identify ergonomic problem areas and allow the users to analyze and solve the ergonomic problem. Health care organizations with mental and physical demanding care processes can be included as intervention- or control-groups, e.g. medical wards and homes for the elderly. The ErgoVSM is now further tested and developed in a Nordic context. The reason for this is our common "Nordic Model" gradually de-

veloped during more than hundred years ("gentlemen's agreement" and trust between the parties). This common Nordic experience creates potentially a unique opportunity to benefit from a tool like ErgoVSM uniting demands for efficiency and good work environment
